

## How to apply for Washington Apple Health

### Online

Applying online will quickly show you whether you're eligible for free health coverage through Washington Apple Health (Medicaid). **You can apply anytime, year-round. Get started at [www.wahealthplanfinder.org](http://www.wahealthplanfinder.org)**

**You'll need this information before you begin:**

- Household monthly income.
- Social Security number and date of birth of each household member applying for Apple Health.
- Immigration information, if that applies to you.

## Are you eligible?

### Apple Health for Adults

You may be eligible if:

- You are between 19 and 65 years old.
- You are a Washington resident.
- You are a U.S. citizen or meet Medicaid immigration requirements.
- You are not incarcerated.
- Your annual household income is at or below the amounts shown in the *Income Eligibility Table* at right.

### Apple Health for Pregnant Women

This program provides coverage to pregnant women with countable income at or below 198 percent of the federal poverty level without regard to citizenship or immigration status. *See the Income Eligibility Table* at right.

### Apple Health for Kids

Coverage is free to children in households with income at or below 215 percent of the federal poverty level and available for a low monthly premium to children in households with income at or below 317 percent of the federal poverty level. *See the Income Eligibility Table* at right.



## Important Reminders

If you're eligible for Apple Health, you can sign up anytime, year-round, at [www.wahealthplanfinder.org](http://www.wahealthplanfinder.org).

Even if you're not eligible for Apple Health, you can explore low-cost private insurance options that may work for you. You can also learn the dates for annual open enrollment.
